GSK sponsors quality research and innovation by supporting Investigator Sponsored Studies (ISS). ISS are usually conducted by the primary investigator (e.g. clinician and/or academic researcher) for purely scientific purposes in areas of interest that also align with the pharmaceutical company. These may include exploring the use of a marketed drug for new indications, in new populations, in new dosage regimes, or in new combinations with other treatments, safety and effectiveness information. Many ISS contribute to and expand medical /scientific knowledge in areas where it may not be commercially viable for a company to initiate the trial on its own.

# Role responsibilities:

- Manage all aspects from start to finish of the ISS lifecycle to support the investigators and GSK
- Liaise with local and global GSK teams for each study to provide them with support and timely information regarding tracking, monitoring, compliance, safety, study progress, payments, and documentation
- Brief and regularly report ISS metrics to local and global medical leadership and ISS teams, e.g. monthly meetings with internal stakeholders
- Assist with management monitoring and risk assessments of the Supported Studies process in Australia
- Deliver training and guidance on processes and responsibilities to the local medical teams
- Seek out opportunities to develop and enhance ways of working for the management and tracking of ISS across the GSK Australia Medical Directorate (Respiratory, Specialty, Oncology and Vaccines).

- This role will demonstrate how pharma experts, academics and clinicians work together on innovative research projects for better health outcomes for patients.
- The role provides the hands-on opportunity to work as part of a highly experienced GSK Australia medical team in a dynamic and supported environment.
